- Whelen Engineering requires the use of waterproof butt splices and/or connectors if that connector could be exposed to moisture.

- If mounting this product requires drilling holes, the installer MUST be sure that no vehicle
 components or other vital parts could be damaged by the drilling process. Check both
 sides of the mounting surface before drilling begins. Also de-burr any holes and remove
 any metal shards or remnants. Install grommets into all wire passage holes.
- Do not install this product or route any wires in the deployment area of your air bag. Equipment mounted or located in the air bag deployment area will damage or reduce the effectiveness of the air bag, or become a projectile that could cause serious personal injury or death. Refer to your vehicle owner's manual for the air bag deployment area. The User/Installer assumes full responsibility to determine proper mounting location, based on providing ultimate safety to all passengers inside the vehicle.
- For this product to operate at optimum efficiency, a good electrical connection to chassis
 ground must be made. The recommended procedure requires the product ground wire to
 be connected directly to the NEGATIVE (-) battery post.

 safely in any driving condition.

Mounting (Standard Bracket)

1. Place the bracket against the mounting surface and mark the two mounting hole locations. Confirm that no vehicle parts could be damaged by the drilling process. Using an appropriately sized bit, drill two mounting holes sized for a #8 sheet metal screw and a wire passage hole (see template below). De-burr all holes and install a grommet in the wire passage hole to protect the wires.

NOTE: VHB adhesive tape is provided as an alternative to securing the ION™ with screws. Remove the protective backing from this tape and press it firmly onto the bottom of the bracket as shown. Clean the mounting surface with a 50/50 mix of isopropyl alcohol and water and dry thoroughly before mounting the bracket onto the mounting surface.

 Route the wires through the hole in the bracket and through the wire passage hole. Secure the ION™ to the bracket using the hardware provided. Wire as outlined below.


Mounting (Gripper Bracket)

- Apply the protective pads to the bracket in the location shown (side view). Secure the ION™ to the bracket in the same fashion as outlined for the standard bracket.
- Position the bracket onto the proposed mounting surface as shown. Apply a drop of Loctite 222 to the threads of the #6 x 13mm PPHMS provided. Thread these screws into the underside of the bracket as shown and secure the bracket to the mounting surface.

Mounting (Surface Mount)

- 1. Using the mounting gasket as a template (specific dimensions shown at right), mark and drill two, 6mm diameter mounting holes and one, 16mm diameter wire passage hole into the proposed mounting surface. Confirm that no vehicle parts could be damaged by the drilling process. Be sure to deburr these three holes before continuing.
- Install the screw grommets provided into the ION™ as shown. Using appropriately sized wire, extend the ION wires through the mounting gasket and mounting surface. Install a switch and fuse (customer supplied) as specified and make all the electrical connections shown in the diagram below.
- 3. Secure the ION $^{\mbox{\tiny TM}}$ to the mounting surface using the hardware provided.




Operation

Scan-Lock™(WHT/VIO) - To advance to the next pattern, apply +VDC to the WHT/VIO wire for less than 1 second. To cycle backwards, apply +VDC for more than 1 second. To reset to the factory default pattern, turn off power to the lighthead. While applying +VDC to the WHT/VIO, turn the lighthead back on. Continue to apply voltage for 5 seconds.

Sync (GREY) - When the Sync wires of two lightheads are connected, lightheads configured to display the Phase 1 mode of a pattern will flash simultaneously. Any lightheads configured to display the Phase 2 mode will alternate with any Phase 1 lightheads with the same pattern.
